

# CARE IN THE COMMUNITY

oleskine Community Care Steering Group, set up last autumn, is moving forward with its plans.

With assistance from SCVO (Scottish Council for Voluntary Organisations) the group is to become a SCIO (Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation). This means that it will be a charity with trustees drawn from and elected by the membership.

"The membership is anyone who supports the aims of the group and who is happy to put their name forward as a Friend of Boleskine Care Group."

The group hopes to have many friends!

Insurance is in place to cover any community event under a 'Community Care' umbrella. The aim is to provide a social event every week of the month. The coffee morning in Foyers and the lunch club are already in place and now, starting on 16th June a 'soup stop' will begin at the Catholic Hall/Steading. It will also provide a free daytime venue to start up new clubs e.g. Gardening, walking etc.

# **Handy Man Service**

A Handy Man Service is being actively investigated with the advice and support of Care in Strathnairn who have been operating for some years. It will take time to get procedures in place but once this is done there is already a small group of volunteers waiting and willing to do those little jobs around the house to make things safer. There is no intention to usurp work undertaken by tradesmen in the area. The service can work closely with them to enable larger jobs to be monitored and assistance given to those that live on their own or are elderly and are not so confident to organise work.

# **Home Care**

Running parallel to these plans the steering group is holding talks with the NHS home care providers. With the help of Margaret Davidson, the local Councillor, we hope to have an influence on home care provision for the area.

A principal aim of the group is to provide local carers for local people. If there is anyone who would like to train as a care worker either now or in the future please get in touch so that we can prove that we would be able to care for our own.

### **Finances**

The Community Trust has provided a set-up fund for the group (£800) and ongoing discussions will take place for future projects between the Trust and Boleskine Community Care (BCC). As a charity it is important to be able to access matching funding from different sources. The Community Trust will therefor be an important initial funding stream. We are fortunate to have it.

BCC will always need help so do please get in touch. Driving, Befriending, Handyman, Walking—anything you think you can do and enjoy and have the time to be able to just give an occasional hour or so every now and then. The more the merrier.....

# **Community Event 11<sup>th</sup> of June**

As part of the revision of our long term plan for South Loch Ness we will be holding a Community Event on the evening of 11<sup>th</sup> of June in Stratherrick Public Hall. Details will appear on The Stratherrick and Foyers Community Website.

### **Plant Health**

Juniper in the Balnagarline area has been confirmed as being infected with *Phytophthora austrocedrae*, a fungal disease which is infecting juniper in several places around Scotland. To help reduce the spread of this disease, please take care not to remove juniper plants, foliage or seed from the countryside.

### Harvesting

The annual harvesting programme for the South Loch Ness area (between forty and fifty thousand tonnes) is under way. This year's harvesting will take place at: Knockie; Sockich Bends; Trinloist; Erchite Bends.

Much of current programme focus is about removing Lodgepole pine infected by a fungus called Dothistroma Needle Blight. Operations have been subject to a fair amount of change due to storm damage during the winter gales which resulted in over fifty thousand tonnes of timber being snapped or blown down. Clear up operations are ongoing and have been spread over two years to manage the impact on the public road network. An additional felling site has been introduced as part of the enabling works for the duelling of the B852 at Sockich Bends. The felling for this is likely to start in September.

New surveys have found that the ideal weather last summer boosted the populations of dragonflies and damselflies in Loch Bran. The loch is one of four top sites in the Highlands for spotting a wide range of the nsects including some of the country's most vulnerable and rare species.

# 'Summer of Discontent'

This summer the strath will experience a great deal of upheaval, inconvenience and destruction.

At Glen Lia and Farigaig Pass the roads will be closed for timber harvesting. This is to allow an upgrade of the main electricity pylons that are needed to take the extra power from the wind farms.

The road improvements at Loch Tarff will mean delays and possible road closure – we await the next public meeting with trepidation!

Other sections of the B862 will also be worked on with traffic lights or hold ups. Originally we were promised 40 new passing places, then it was reduced to a half dozen until finally one has been built - so far.

Instead, we will have sections of the B862 that will be duelled such as the east end of Gorthleck and at Loch Tarff. The lovely old birch trees at Loch Tarff will be felled to make way for a wider and certainly less scenic road. Did we really need this section to be duelled?

Who benefits? The public road to Corriegarth Estate certainly benefits with a fine tarred surface – every entrance to the cow fields are tarred (see photo on page 5). While the rest of us have to put up with the pot holes at our gateways.

And what about the lapwings and curlews – do they benefit. Sadly no. They are being discouraged from nesting by scary looking faces and flapping kites pretending to be birds of prey. But why? We do not know, but they were installed by the wind farm company which is soon to start construction work on the Corriegarth Estate – yet more upheaval and heavy traffic.

Elsewhere in the strath a hydro-electric pipeline is being constructed at Knockie— yet more destruction of trees and wild habitats this time partly through a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI).

And there is more - the giant Stronelairg windfarm and Dell windfarm are waiting in the wings and a new windfarm at Aberarder has just been proposed. When will it all end? Perhaps it is time this community took a stand and decided enough is enough.

# No Road Closures - YET

At a recent public meeting R.J. McLeod announced that the B862 to Fort Augustus will not close at present. They are deciding how to deal with the critical 300m section of the road at Loch Tarff where significant cutting into the embankment is required. No work will start on that section until a further public meeting has been held.

On the remaining section beside Loch Tarff, (900m) single lane traffic can be maintained during construction. NO road closures will be needed for this section of work other than a single daytime closure to lay the road surfacing at the tie-in positions at the end of the works.

### There will be another public meeting in early June.

# Inverfarigaig Road closures


# May - Mid August 7am - 7pm.

# Foot paths closed.

All the core footpaths between Glenlia and Foyers will be closed for the same period. For those that enjoy an evening stroll they will open at 7pm!

Corriegarth windfarm (construction due to start this year) has applied for an increase in the number of wind turbines. This has yet to be determined. But the developer has refused to renegotiate the community benefit which stands at than half the current energy standard contribution. i.e. they have offered £2,000 per megawatt rather than £5,000 per megawatt.

# **UPDATE** from Cllr Margaret Davidson

The headline for this past quarter has undoubtedly been road closures. Highland Council proposed a 7 week closure at Loch Tarff and a 12 week closure at Sockich Bends. I chaired a packed public meeting at Stratherrick public hall. The roads engineers and the council were in listening mode as I asked them to be. The evening was followed by a further drop-in session that clearly evidenced that the proposed timing of closures would damage local businesses and was unacceptable; some wished for a single track improvement rather than a twin tracking at Loch Tarff. Thanks to all who turned out that evening. By the end we had a clear agreement

- The proposed closure dates would not be going ahead as planned.
- Both Highland Council and R.J. Macleod were to consider and work up some alternatives.
- The area causing a problem is about 300m long.
- Another public meeting will be called to discuss further.
- Sockich Bends .....It became apparent that the presence of squirrel dreys meant the work could not go ahead this spring.
- The proposed diversion at Dunlichity was scarcely fit for purpose, few passing places, poor road alignment and narrow.
- A follow up meeting about Sockich bends will be called at Farr Hall, to discuss alternative dates, diversions and project methods.

So, watch the web sites and notice boards for new dates and we will try to get some flyers out. Thanks to all who turned out and gave their views, and to all who helped with flyers. We still have a long way to go to find a sensible and acceptable solution for both Loch Tarff and Sockich. Meantime R.J. Macleod have started work on some of the areas where the Council has agreement and there are only minimal needs to close the road (e.g. just to pour tar!)

A few other updates - Morag Cameron from Foyers and I are looking for folks with an interest in sports development and sports facilities. We will call an informal meeting in early June and arrange for a few visits to other communities to look at their facilities over the summer. Wider, public meeting can be held in autumn. If you have an interest, and I am sure there are many people with an interest in sports out there, then please get in touch. Land at Lower Foyers - Discussions continue with the Community Trust and it is hoped to work through a Scottish Land Fund Lottery application in June. Community Care Group - This group has done really well and is drawing up a plan of work. We are meeting again with NHS Highland to find a solution to the perennial problem of home care for South Loch Ness. If you have had problems over the past 2 years or are having problems right now let myself or Jane o' Donovan know about it and we will do our level best to help find a solution for you.

I will be starting my councillor surgeries again in June and am always available on numbers below.

# STRATHERRICK AND FOYERS COMMUNITY COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S A.G.M. REPORT MAY 2014

I would like to thank my fellow CC members for their support and hard work over the last year and what a year! a full and very busy one with almost double the normal number of meetings. These were needed to get through the large number of issues affecting our community over the year, largely created by the significant number of Renewable developments within our area. Of course they then provide the future opportunities to invest in and build a sustainable community using the Community Benefit funds the community will receive.

Early misinformation and lack of it was frustrating but thankfully quickly overcome, giving way to the pleasure and enjoyment of helping community groups take the first steps forward with their aspirations.

I believe the Boleskine Community Care group is the most critical and important one for the sustainability and wellbeing of our community, demonstrated by the community demographics and the implications of them for the next 3 decades on our already limited community & care services.

This also highlights the need for a modern community facility designed and built for minimal running costs to act as a focal point for a mix of community activities and services. Such a community centre with associated facilities will help bring our dispersed community together and encourage our younger members to remain within the area for their education and working life. Facilities aspired to include all weather sports area, changing rooms, new hall with bleacher seating suitable for concerts and indoor sports, meeting rooms of varying sizes suitable for use by groups and care support services.

We will continue to work with the **Highland Small Community Housing Trust and Albyn Housing** to bring forward affordable housing to assist families in to a local home and help vulnerable community members to remain in the area by provision of housing designed for their needs. **Next update at CC meeting, 10**<sup>th</sup> **June, Foyers School.** 

The realisation of the legal and binding Sole Member Resolutions made by the CC early in the year, ultimately have led to the new Trust board creating systems/ policies and developing existing ones to bring the company's management structure to an expected position, of being fit for purpose for these ever more demanding and complicated days. Hopefully these will include another main aspiration of the community identified within the Trust survey results, for all their meetings to be held in public, proving the Trust is fully open and accountable to the community. The CC, the democratically elected representative of the community, have currently opted to give the Trust its present privilege of managing and dispersing the funds for the benefit and sustainable future of our entire community whose money it is. I am sure, if the Trust holds public meetings, this would significantly improve community and Trust engagement, enabling all to work together for the future benefit of all.

Overall I believe we have had a very successful first year and I look forward to working with the Community Councillors, Trust directors and community members to develop a sustainable and successful community.

# Local Fireman wins medal for 20 year milestone



In a grand ceremony in Inverness, local Fireman, lain Hepburn, was awarded a 'long service good conduct' medal by the Scottish Fire & Rescue Service. With 20 years of dedication, he is the longest serving member of the Foyers Fire & Rescue team.

The team took the opportunity to quiz Iain about his time in the service thus far.

# When did you join and what were the early years like?

I joined in 1993 and, as a small team, led back then by Colin Evans, we trained just once a month. Our equipment was pretty basic and when we got a 'shout', we had no Fire Appliance of our own, so used our own vehicles to carry the equipment and get to any incident.

# **How different is it now?**

Chalk and cheese. We are miles ahead from those early days. Now we have dedicated equipment, a fully equipped fire station and some fantastic training. We train every week and it's really very professional now.

# What sort of incidents have you attended?

Everything you can possibly think of, from burst pipes to traffic collisions, house fires, hill fires and everything in between.

# <u>Do you think having a locally based Fire Service is important?</u>

Yes, absolutely. I firmly believe that local fire stations should be kept open. Because we are local, we know the people and the geography well and can attend any incident swiftly. It takes us only 5-10 minutes from when the bleeps go off to us getting mobile to the incident.

# What are your hopes for the future of the local service?

I would like to encourage more people to join. We have a great team of experienced firefighters at present and the camaraderie and teamwork makes the job really satisfying. We work hard and treat the role very seriously but we also have a lot of fun in the process. It would be great to have a couple more members.

# What would you say to anyone considering joining the fire service?

Go for it. If you like working in a team, learning new things and making a positive contribution to the local community, then this is a great way to do it. Also, the training makes you ready to face any emergency and, when the time comes for you to act, you can give practical help to those in dire need and perhaps even save a life.

The rest of lain's team clubbed together to purchase a fine looking wristwatch to help him celebrate his 20 years.....and to help him get to the fire station on time! Thank you lain......and here's to the next 20.

# More On The Whitebridge Bus

By the 1890's the mail and transport to Stratherrick had become erratic so in 1896 the Post Office awarded the contract to a more reliable contractor - Mr Donald Macgillivray, owner of the general stores at Gorthleck. A stagecoach was used for the service. Donald Macgillivray had the only hearse in Stratherrick which was turned out with four black horses complete with head plumes. We can only visualise such a scene locally today. An Albion JS 86 was purchased in 1910 driven by Lachlan Mackenzie and in 1912 my Uncle Simon Fraser replaced him as driver. In 1916 Donald Macgillivray decided to concentrate on his other activities and Simon took over his bus and the Royal Mail contract.

In 1920 Simon replaced his Albion with a Studebaker and again in 1924 for a striking yellow Fiat. In 1928 Simon's eldest daughter Nanny then a young girl went to Kintore with her father to collect a new De Dion Bouton ST 5051. It had 20 seats, a rear mail compartment and lettered Stratherrick Mail Service. Then again in 1932 Simon bought a Bedford ST6695 and replaced it with a Dodge AST616 in 1939.

Up until 1928 the route to Whitebridge was by Dores and Torness and thereafter by Leys and Farr. D MacBraynes then covered Dores with their Foyers service. Simon's younger daughter Cathy recalled that on a few occasions due to snow the bus did not get through and one time on her way home the night was spent in the bus between Dumnaglass and Calanour junction, her father keeping the passengers happy.

32 years of hard work and loyal service were beginning to take their toll on Simon's health and on 4th August 1944 he was forced to relinquish his service. His son Ewan was too young to take over the business. With reluctance he retired to the farm at Wester Aberchalder now relaxing and driving his beloved Fergie tractor. He passed away in 1950 and many tributes were paid from the folks of Stratherrick, Strathnairn and the Post Office staff.

On the 5th August 1944 D. MacBraynes took over the service in their distinguished red cream and

green livery.


